

STAFF

THE FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE DEPARTMENT IS CURRENTLY AUTHORIZED 25 COMMISSIONED POLICE OFFICERS AND 3 CIVILIAN STAFF. THE DEPARTMENT IS COMPRISED OF 4 SECTIONS; ADMINISTRATION, PATROL, INVESTIGATIONS, AND ANIMAL CONTROL. EACH SECTION HAS ITS OWN UNIQUE RESPONSIBILITIES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT:

ADMINISTRATION:





ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF IS RESPONSIBLE FOR EVERY FUNCTION OF THE DEPARTMENT INCLUDING SCHEDULING, PAYROLL, TRAINING, RECORDS, COMPLAINTS, BUDGETING, AND IMPLEMENTING POLICIES TO CREATE AN EFFICIENT AND PROFESSIONAL POLICE DEPARTMENT.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION:

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS IS COMPRISED OF 1 SERGEANT AND 2 INVESTIGATORS THAT HANDLE NUMEROUS FUNCTIONS INCLUDING INVESTIGATING CRIMINAL OFFENSES, COLLECTION AND SECURING OF EVIDENCE, COURT PREPARATION, AND MUCH MORE.







ANIMAL CONTROL:

THE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 1 ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER. THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR HANDLING ALL CALLS REGARDING DEER OR OTHER WILDLIFE, AS WELL AS PETS AND LIVESTOCK. THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING RECORDS REGARDING ANIMALS AND EDUCATING THE PUBLIC ON ANIMAL RELATED ISSUES.

PATROL DIVISION:

THE PATROL DIVISION IS THE LARGEST DIVISION IN THE DEPARTMENT WITH 20 OFFICERS. IT IS MADE UP OF 4 SECTIONS WITH DAY AND NIGHT PATROL CONSISTING OF 1 SERGEANT AND 4 PATROL OFFICERS PER SHIFT. THE PATROL DIVISION CONDUCTS THE DAY TO DAY OPERATIONS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY ARE THE MOST VISIBLE ASPECT OF THE CITY AND ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING PUBLIC SAFETY AND ANSWERING CALLS FOR SERVICE.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY:

SINCE 2018, FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE OFFICERS HAVE HOSTED OUR JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY FOR CHILDREN AGES 8 TO 11. OUR 2020 JUNIOR ACADEMY WAS POSTPONED ORIGINALLY DUE TO COVID-19 AND ULTIMATELY CANCELLED ALTOGETHER FOR THE YEAR.

WE HOPE THE ON-GOING PANDEMIC WILL SUBSIDE SO WE MAY RESUME THE JUNIOR ACADEMY IN THE SUMMER OF 2021.



NATIONAL NIGHT OUT:

EVERY YEAR, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT COORDINATES AND PARTICIPATES IN NATIONAL NIGHT OUT. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT ATTENDS SEPARATE EVENTS FOR THE EVENING WHERE OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO MEET AND EAT WITH OUR COMMUNITY. UNFORTUNATELY, 2020'S NATIONAL NIGHT OUT WAS CANCELLED DUE TO THE ON-GOING PANDEMIC. WE HOPE TO RESUME THE PROGRAM IN 2021.





EASTER BUNNY PARADE:

IN 2020, THE FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE DEPARTMENT ESCORTED THE EASTER BUNNY THROUGHOUT THE CITY IN AN EASTER PARADE. THIS WAS OUR FIRST TIME INCORPORATING AN EVENT FOR EASTER. WE LOOK FORWARD TO EXPANDING THIS EVENT IN THE YEARS TO COME.







BIRTHDAY PARADES:

SINCE STAY AT HOME ORDERS WERE PUT IN PLACE, OFFICERS PARTICIPATED IN THE BIRTHDAY PARADE TREND. OFFICERS ATTENDED OVER 40 BIRTHDAY PARADES IN THE CITY FOR RESIDENTS OF ALL AGES.

TRUNK OR TREAT:

In 2020, the Police Dept. Hosted their second annual trunk or treat event at the police department. Officers decorated their patrol cars and created candy chutes to distribute candy in order to maintain social distancing.

BUDDY IS A BELGIAN MALINOIS WITH A CHARACTER THAT MATCHES OUR OFFICERS. HIS HANDLER IS OFFICER DAVID MAGNESS WHO HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 2003.

IN 2020, BUDDY CONDUCTED SEVERAL DEPLOYMENTS BEFORE BEING DIAGNOSED WITH A SPINAL INJURY IN JULY 2020.

DR. GILES WITH BLUEPEARL PERFORMED A SUCCESSFUL SURGERY IN SEPTEMBER IN WHICH A STABILIZER WAS IMPLANTED. BUDDY'S RECOVERY HAS BEEN LENGTHY BUT WE EXPECT HIM BACK TO FULL DUTY IN SPRING 2021



ACCOMPLISHMENTS

TEXAS POLICE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION RECOGNITION PROGRAM

In 2010, the Police DEPARTMENT WAS RECOGNIZED AS A BEST PRACTICES AGENCY FROM THE TEXAS POLICE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION.

EVERY YEAR SINCE, WE ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION THAT WE ARE UPHOLDING THOSE SAME STANDARDS. ADDITIONALLY, EVERY 4^{TH} YEAR AN ON-SITE ASSESSMENT IS COMPLETED BY SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

IN 2020, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SUCCESSFULLY SUBMITTED ALL REQUIRED ANNUAL PAPERWORK TO MAINTAIN OUR COMPLIANCE WITH THE RECOGNITION PROGRAM.



7TH SAFEST CITY:

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR HOME SAFETY AND SECURITY & SAFEWISE USED NEW FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION DATA ALONG WITH INTERNAL DATA AND RESEARCH TO CREATE ITS LIST, WHICH RANKS WHICH CITIES IN TEXAS ARE SAFEST RELATIVE TO THEIR VIOLENT CRIME RATE AND POPULATION.

In 2019, Fair Oaks Ranch ranked as the 5th Safest City in Texas. In 2020 our rank fell to the 7^{th} safest City

FAIR OAKS RANCH IS ALSO THE ONLY CITY WITHIN THE GREATER SAN ANTONIO AREA, OR ALL OF SOUTH TEXAS THAT IS RANKED IN THE TOP 30 SAFEST CITIES.

In-Service Training:

OFFICERS AND SUPERVISORS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT HAVE BEEN RESPONSIBLE FOR COORDINATING AND HOSTING TRAINING FROM SEVERAL ENTITIES INCLUDING THE KENDALL COUNTY SHERIFF'S TRAINING CADRE, SAM HOUSTON STATE UNIVERSITY, THE TEXAS MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION, ALAMO AREA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY, AS WELL AS COURSES INSTRUCTED BY OUR OWN OFFICERS.

IN 2020, DUE TO THE PANDEMIC TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES WERE VERY LIMITED. STILL, SEVERAL OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO COMPLETE REQUIRED TRAINING IN ADVANCEMENT OF THEIR TCOLE PEACE OFFICER LICENSES. THE DEPARTMENTS OFFICERS CURRENTLY HOLD THE FOLLOWING LICENSES:

- 4 MASTER PEACE OFFICERS
- 2 ADVANCED PEACE OFFICERS
- 7 Intermediate Peace Officers
- 12 Licensed Peace Officers

IN 2020, SERGEANT CHRIS GRIFFIN AND OFFICER RILEY GOBEIL GRADUATED FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY PHYSICAL FITNESS INSTITUTE. THE PHYSICAL FITNESS INSTITUTE IS COMPRISED OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS FROM AROUND THE STATE OF TEXAS BOTH INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL TO TEXAS DPS. EACH STUDENT IN THE INSTITUTE GRADUATES WITH THE KNOWLEDGE TO PROVIDE SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTISE RESULTANT OF THEIR TIRELESS ENDURING OF THE ACADEMIC AND PHYSICAL RIGORS OF THIS SIX-WEEK COURSE. STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE THEIR KNOWLEDGE IN WRITTEN FORM AND PARTICIPATION IN A BOARD DEFENSE. THE BOARD DEFENSE WAS IN FRONT OF AGENCY

EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP, POLICE CHIEFS, LEGAL
REPRESENTATIVES, EXERCISE PHYSIOLOGIST, POLICE
ORGANIZATIONS, AND RISK MANAGEMENT OFFICE.

WITH THIS CERTIFICATION, THE POLICE DEPT.
HOPES TO DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN A HEALTH AND
FITNESS PROGRAM FOR ALL CITY STAFF WHO WISH TO
PARTICIPATE OR EDUCATE THEMSELVES ON PROPER
NUTRITION AND EXERCISE.





FORMAL EDUCATION:

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CONTINUALLY ENCOURAGES OFFICERS TO ENROLL AND CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION THROUGH INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING. THE DEPARTMENT SUPPORTS OFFICERS' EFFORTS TO ATTEND UNIVERSITIES, WHETHER IN PERSON OR ONLINE, AND PROVIDES INCENTIVES FOR OFFICERS TO DO SO.

In 2020, the Department has 7 Officers with at least a Bachelor's Degree.

ADDITIONALLY, THERE ARE 6 OFFICERS CURRENTLY ENROLLED AND SEEKING BACHELOR'S DEGREES, AND 2 CURRENTLY WORKING ON OBTAINING THEIR GRADUATE DEGREES, ALL WHILE CONTINUING TO WORK FULL-TIME FOR THE RESIDENTS OF FAIR OAKS RANCH.








