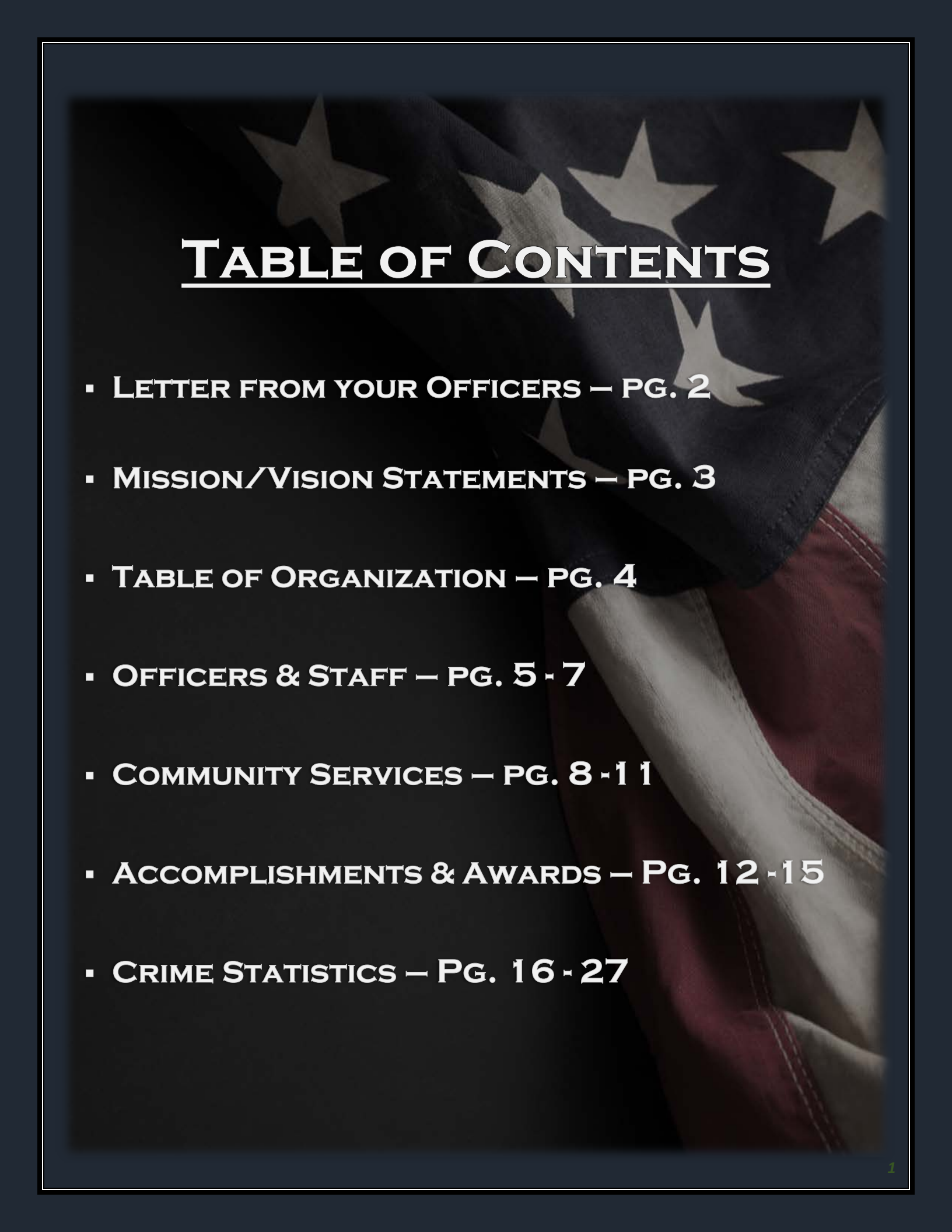

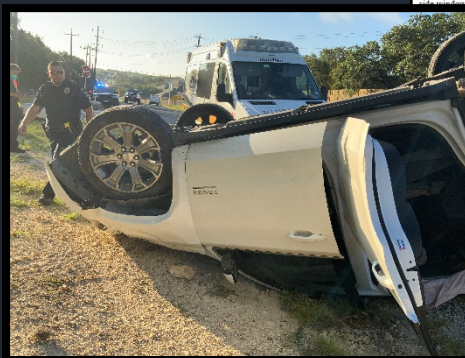
ADMINISTRATION:



ADMINISTRATION IS COMPRISED OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE, THE LIEUTENANT, THE DEPARTMENT'S ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT, AND AN ADMIN. CLERK. ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF IS RESPONSIBLE FOR EVERY DAY FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT INCLUDING SCHEDULING, PAYROLL, TRAINING, RECORDS, COMPLAINTS, BUDGETING, AND IMPLEMENTING POLICIES TO CREATE AN EFFICIENT AND PROFESSIONAL POLICE DEPARTMENT.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION:

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS IS COMPOSED OF 1 SERGEANT AND 2 INVESTIGATORS THAT HANDLE NUMEROUS FUNCTIONS INCLUDING INVESTIGATING CRIMINAL OFFENSES, COLLECTION AND SECURING OF EVIDENCE, COURT PREPARATION, AND MUCH MORE.

ILLEGAL DUMPING - 5 to 500 pounds

Around October of 2020, the Fair Oaks Ranch Police Department Officers began noticing bags of debris that were discarded into the middle of the roadway along Dietz Elkhorn. After the first several instances, and after receiving reports from both City Maintenance personnel and residents, Officers began documenting the debris, which was later determined to be plastic shopping bags that contained large amount of animal feces and cat litter. These bags of feces were found numerous times over the past several months and in varying locations along Dietz Elkhorn including resident's driveways and several times on top of the crosswalk during the school year.

Police Department personnel, along with assistance from the City Maintenance dept, began monitoring those sections of Dietz Elkhorn in an attempt to identify the suspect. In January 2021, Officers were able to identify a suspect vehicle through surveillance camera footage. Officers monitored the vehicles activity over the next several weeks until July 20th, when the suspect vehicle was observed at a residence in the Windemere subdivision.

Officers observed the suspect vehicle leave a residence and begin driving west bound on Dietz Elkhorn. As officers followed the vehicle, they observed the driver throw two large bags of feces out of the passenger side window. At a later time showed a total weight of 50lbs. Officers conducted a traffic stop and arrested the driver as Donald Erwin Schwartz, 71 years old, of Pleasant Valley. Schwartz was arrested on Illegal Dumping (5 to 500lbs) and booked into the Bexar County Jail and later released on a \$10,000 bond. The Police Department is expected to file additional charges from the previous cases that will be filed with Schwartz. In all, the Police Dept. believes that Schwartz is responsible for over 20 bags of feces.

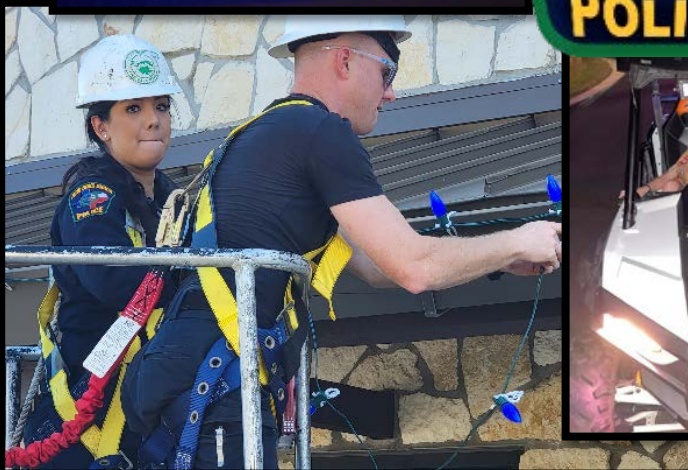


ANIMAL CONTROL:

THE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 1 ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER WHOSE DUTIES CONSIST OF HANDLING ALL CALLS REGARDING PETS, LIVESTOCK, DEER, AND OTHER WILDLIFE. THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR MAINTAINING RECORDS REGARDING ANIMALS AND EDUCATING THE PUBLIC ON ANIMAL RELATED ISSUES.

PATROL DIVISION:

THE PATROL DIVISION IS THE LARGEST DIVISION IN THE DEPARTMENT WITH 20 OFFICERS. IT IS MADE UP OF 4 SECTIONS WITH DAY AND NIGHT PATROL CONSISTING OF 1 SERGEANT AND 4 PATROL OFFICERS PER SHIFT. THE PATROL DIVISION CONDUCTS THE DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY ARE THE MOST VISIBLE ASPECT OF THE CITY AND ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING PUBLIC SAFETY AS WELL AS ANSWERING CALLS FOR SERVICE.





K-9 BUDDY:

BUDDY, our K9 OFFICER IS IN HIS 4TH YEAR OF SERVICE TO FAIR OAKS RANCH. HIS HANDLER IS OFFICER DAVID MAGNESS WHO HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 2003. AFTER BEING DIAGNOSED WITH A SPINAL INJURY AND UNDERGOING SURGERY IN 2020, BUDDY RETURNED TO FULL DUTY IN 2021.

2021 WINTER STORM



IN FEBRUARY, OFFICERS WORKED EFFORTLESSLY AROUND THE CLOCK DURING THE WINTER STORM TO ENSURE EMERGENCY SERVICES WERE AVAILABLE WITHOUT INTERRUPTION. OFFICERS ASSISTED STRANDED MOTORISTS, PROVIDED SAFE TRAVEL TO RESIDENTS RETURNING HOME, AND ASSISTED CITY CREWS WITH DE-ICING THE ROADWAYS. OFFICERS REMAINED AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR OVER 5 DAYS STRAIGHT TO ENSURE EMERGENCY SERVICES WERE READILY AVAILABLE. WE WOULD LIKE TO ESPECIALLY THANK ALL THE RESIDENTS WHO DONATED FOOD AND DRINKS AFTER OUR SUPPLIES HAD RUN LOW.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY:

SINCE 2018, FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE OFFICERS HAS HOSTED OUR JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY FOR CHILDREN AGES 8 TO 11. OUR 2020 JUNIOR ACADEMY WAS CANCELLED DUE TO COVID. HOWEVER, WE WERE EXCITED TO BRING IT BACK IN JUNE OF 2021.

THROUGHOUT THE WEEK STUDENTS WERE ABLE TO LEARN WHAT IT IS LIKE TO BE A POLICE OFFICER IN FAIR OAKS. STUDENTS LEARNED ABOUT GUN SAFETY, DRUG AWARENESS, PATROL OPERATIONS, HANDCUFFING, DAILY PHYSICAL FITNESS TRAINING, CPR AND FIRST AID, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY, HOW TO BE PARTNERS WITH THEIR COMMUNITY.

THE WEEKLONG CONFERENCE IS AN ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TO DEVELOPING FEMALE LAW ENFORCEMENT PROFESSIONALS THROUGH TRAINING AND NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES. THE CONFERENCE PROVIDES THE WOMEN OF LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCESS TO OVER 30 TRAINING CLASSES IN ONE LOCATION IN WHICH ALL INSTRUCTORS ARE WOMEN AS WELL. 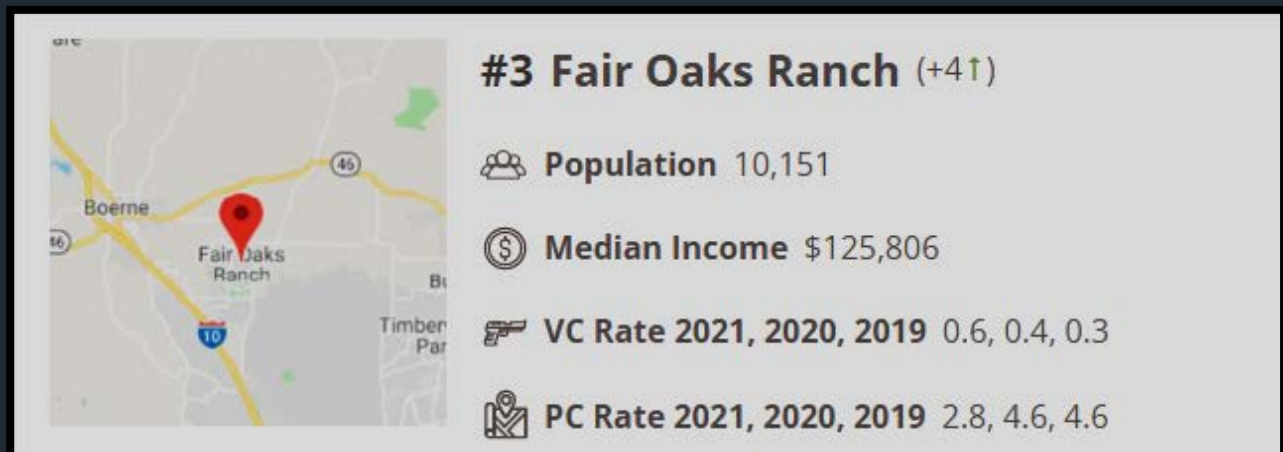


3RD SAFEST CITY:

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR HOME SAFETY AND SECURITY & SAFEWISE USED NEW FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION DATA ALONG WITH INTERNAL DATA AND RESEARCH TO CREATE ITS LIST. THESE ORGANIZATIONS RANK WHICH CITIES IN TEXAS ARE SAFEST RELATIVE TO THEIR VIOLENT CRIME RATE AND POPULATION.

IN 2020, FAIR OAKS RANCH RANKED AS THE 7TH SAFEST CITY IN TEXAS. IN 2021 OUR RANKING ROSE TO THE 3RD SAFEST CITY IN THE STATE OF TEXAS.

FAIR OAKS RANCH IS THE HIGHEST RANKED CITY IN THE GREATER SAN ANTONIO AREA, AND ONE OF ONLY TWO GREATER SAN ANTONIO AREA CITIES IN THE TOP 40.



TEXAS POLICE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION RECOGNITION PROGRAM

IN 2010, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS RECOGNIZED AS A BEST PRACTICES AGENCY FROM THE TEXAS POLICE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION.

EVERY YEAR SINCE, WE ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION THAT WE ARE UPHOLDING THOSE SAME STANDARDS. ADDITIONALLY, EVERY 4TH YEAR AN ON-SITE ASSESSMENT IS COMPLETED BY SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

IN 2021, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SUCCESSFULLY SUBMITTED ALL REQUIRED ANNUAL PAPERWORK TO MAINTAIN OUR COMPLIANCE WITH THE RECOGNITION PROGRAM.

ADDITIONALLY, CHIEF MORING WAS NAMED AS THE REGION 7 DIRECTOR OF THE TEXAS POLICE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION AND LT. JOHN OJEDA WAS CERTIFIED AS AN ASSESSOR FOR THE BEST PRACTICES RECOGNITION PROGRAM.



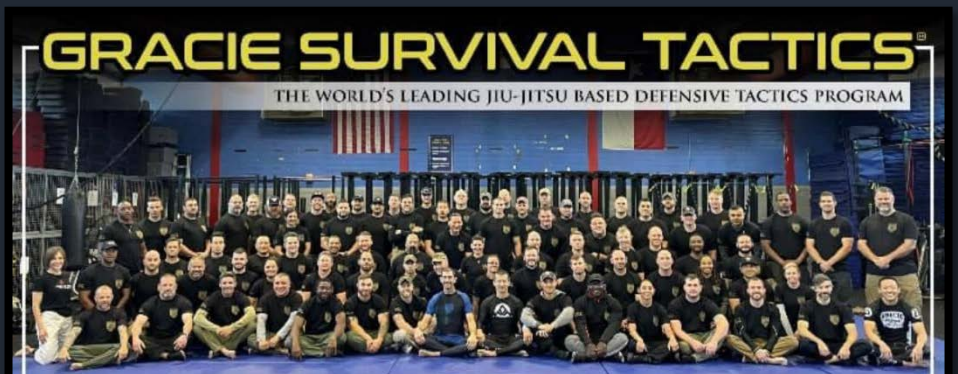
IN-SERVICE TRAINING:

IT HAS BEEN A LONG-STANDING POLICY OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE THE BEST AND MOST FREQUENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR OUR OFFICERS TO ATTEND TRAINING. WE BELIEVE TRAINING IS ESSENTIAL IN PROVIDING SUPERIOR SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY AND WE STRIVE TO ENSURE THAT OUR OFFICERS CONTINUALLY EDUCATE THEMSELVES AND OTHER OFFICERS ON A DAILY BASIS.

ALTHOUGH TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES WERE STILL LIMITED DUE TO THE PANDEMIC, THE DEPARTMENT WAS ABLE TO PROVIDE NUMEROUS IN-HOUSE TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES TO OFFICERS AS WELL AS SENDING THEM TO SPECIALIZED COURSES. THESE IN-SERVICE COURSES WERE ESSENTIAL IN ADVANCING THE CERTIFICATION LEVELS OF SEVERAL OFFICERS. THE DEPARTMENTS OFFICERS CURRENTLY HOLD THE FOLLOWING LICENSES:

- 4 MASTER PEACE OFFICERS
- 4 ADVANCED PEACE OFFICERS
- 6 INTERMEDIATE PEACE OFFICERS
- 7 LICENSED PEACE OFFICERS

THE DEPARTMENT ADDED 4 ADDITIONAL TCOLE INSTRUCTORS IN 2021. ADDITIONALLY, SGT. PAUL ZEPEDA AND OFF. AMANDA HINOJOSA SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE COURSE THAT ALLOWS THE DEPARTMENT TO TRAIN OFFICERS ON SURVIVAL TACTICS WHICH INCLUDE GUN DEFENSE, DE-ESCALATION, SUSPECT & GROUND CONTROL AND EFFECTIVE DECISION MAKING UNDER STRESSFUL SITUATIONS. THIS TRAINING HELPS OFFICERS TO EFFECTIVELY AND EFFICIENTLY CONTROL DYNAMIC SITUATIONS AND MOST IMPORTANTLY REDUCES THE POTENTIAL FOR INJURIES TO OFFICERS.



FORMAL EDUCATION:

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CONTINUALLY ENCOURAGES OFFICERS TO CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION. THE DEPARTMENT SUPPORTS OFFICERS' EFFORTS TO ATTEND UNIVERSITIES, WHETHER IN PERSON OR ONLINE, AND PROVIDES INCENTIVES FOR OFFICERS TO DO SO.

IN 2021, THE DEPARTMENT HAS 8 OFFICERS WITH AT LEAST A BACHELOR'S DEGREE. ADDITIONALLY, THE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 4 OFFICERS ENROLLED IN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS, AND THREE OFFICERS CURRENTLY SEEKING THEIR GRADUATE DEGREES.

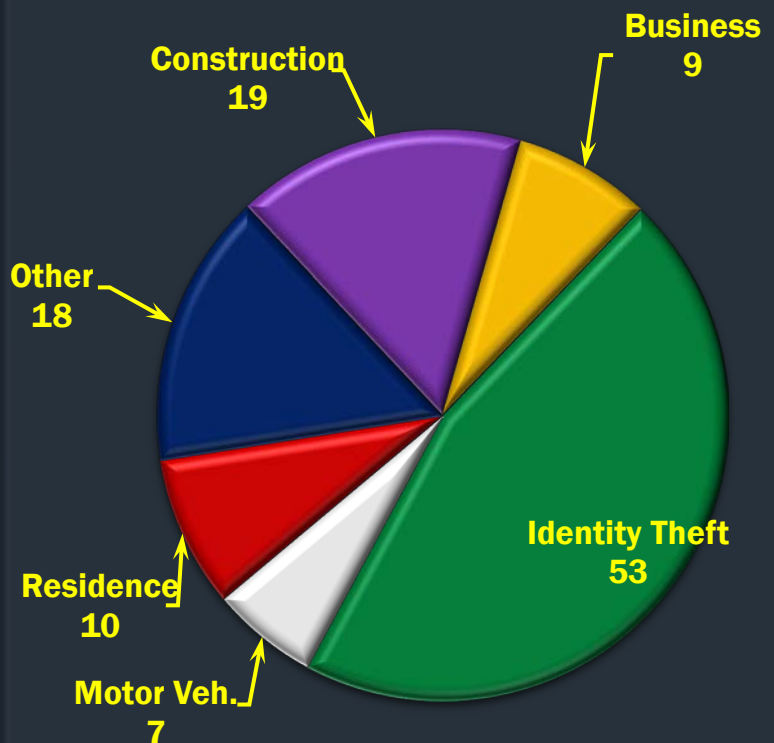

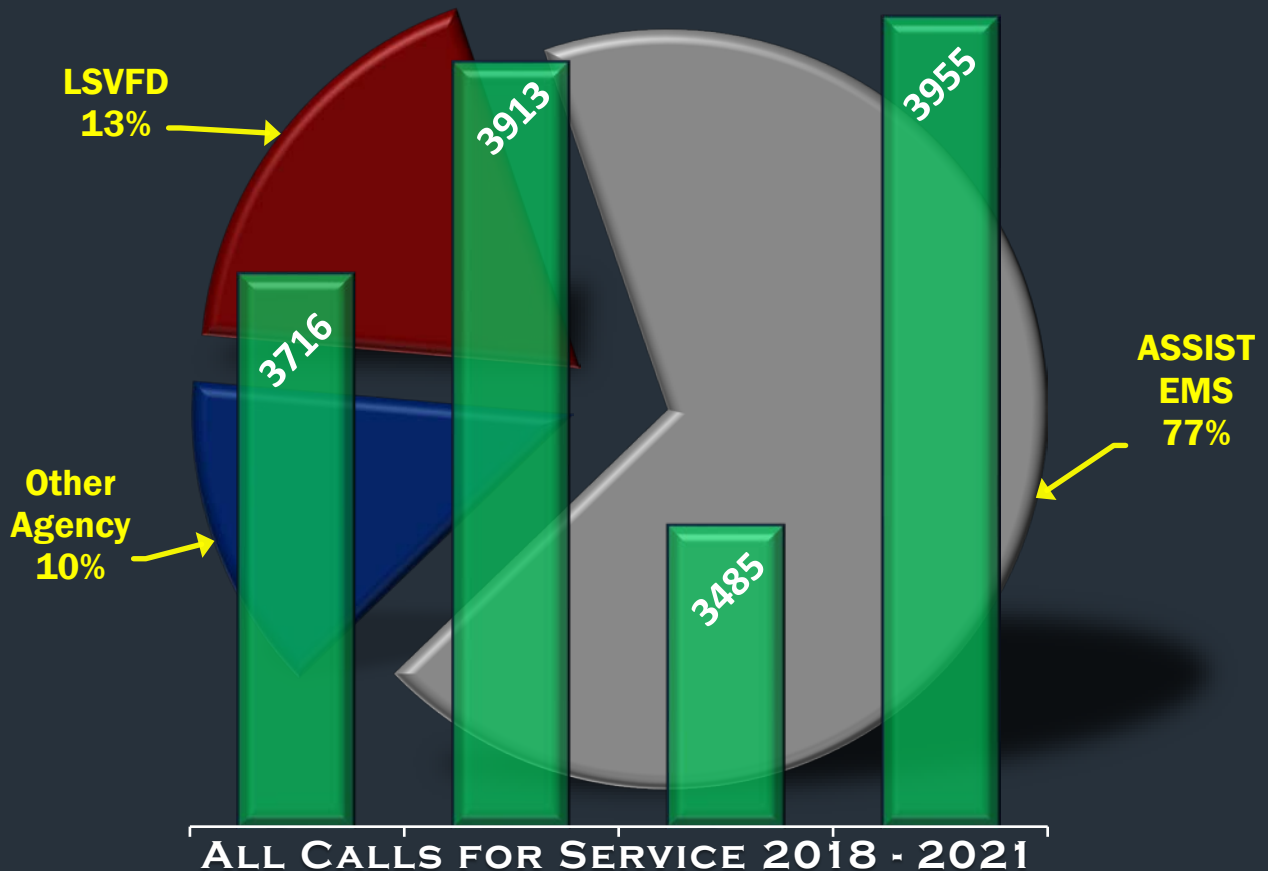

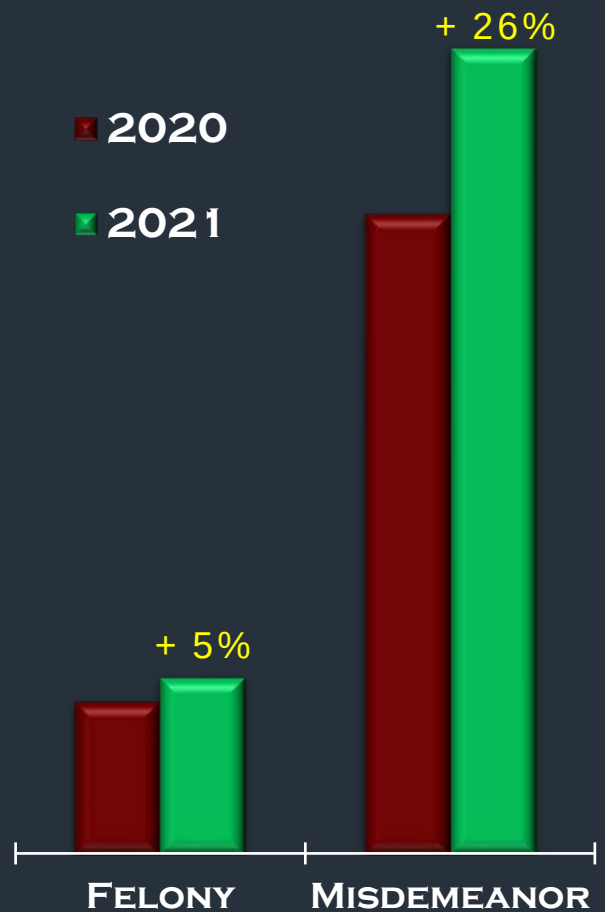

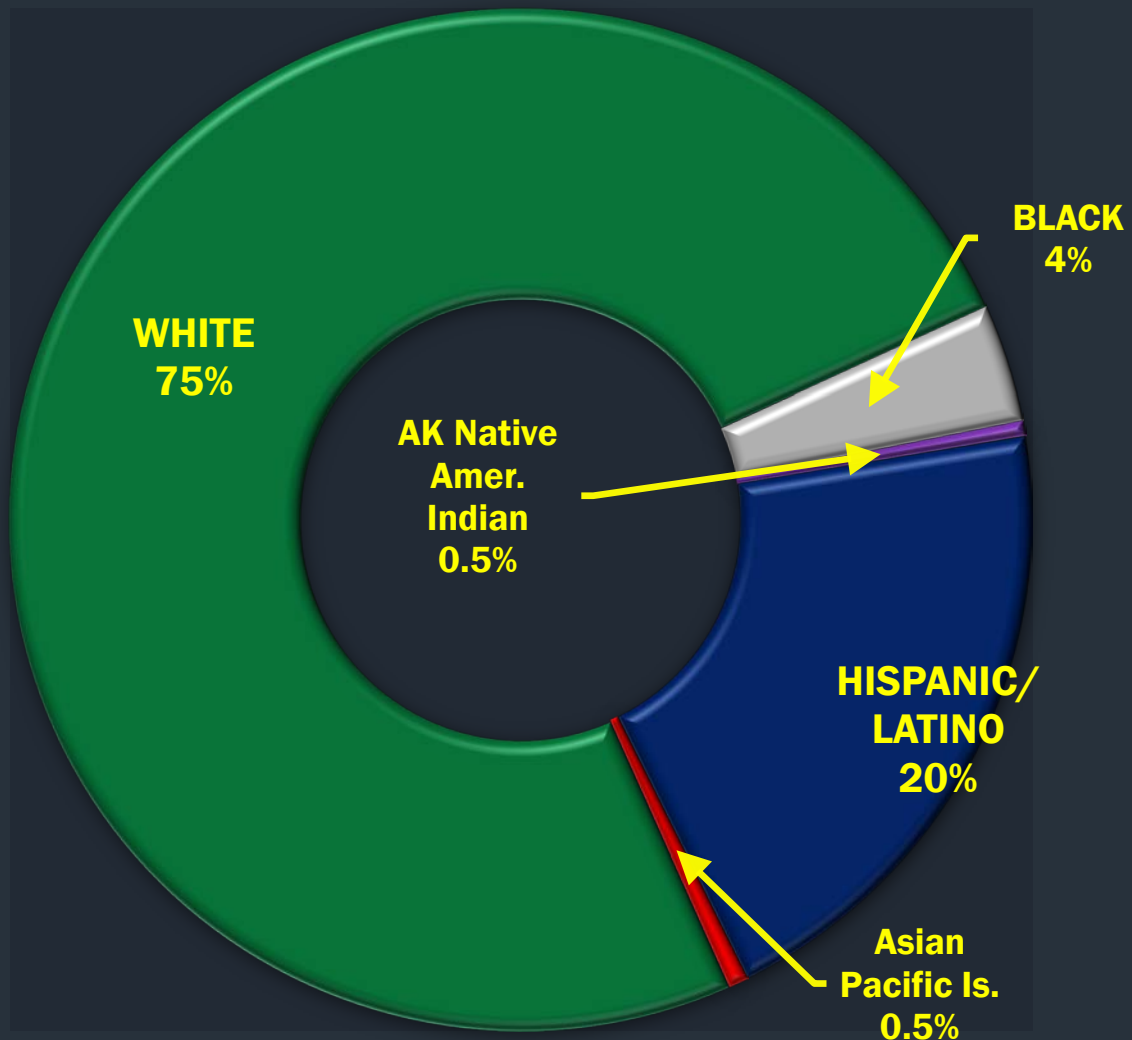

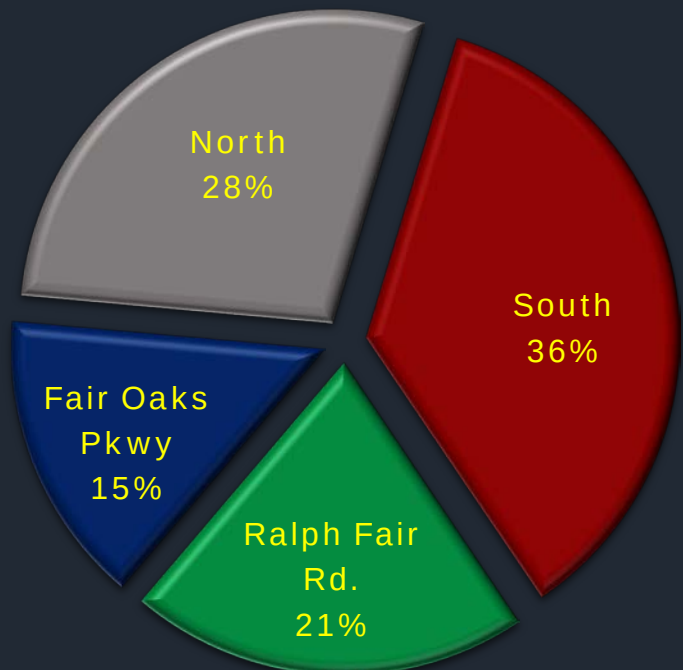

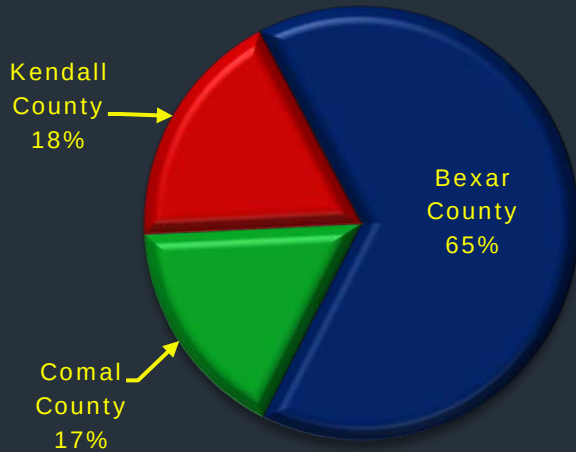

PERCENTAGE OF TIME OUT OF CITY ON ARRESTS

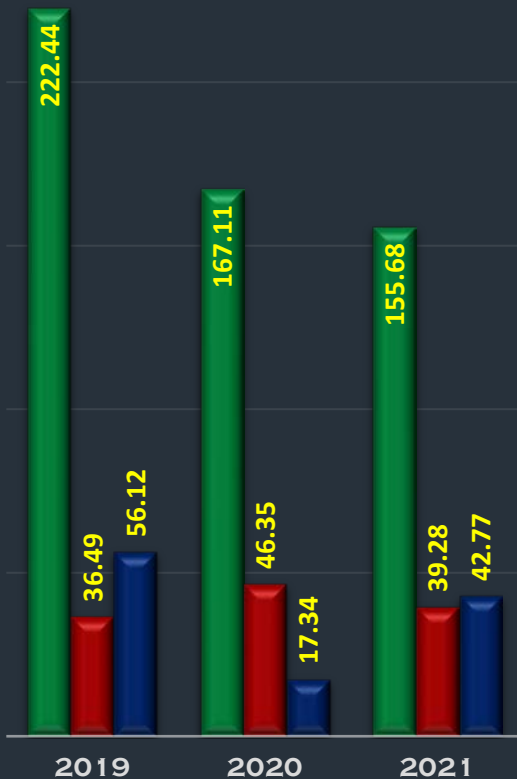


TIME OUT OF CITY 2019-2021
