STAFF

THE FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE DEPARTMENT IS CURRENTLY AUTHORIZED 27 COMMISSIONED POLICE OFFICERS AND 3 CIVILIAN STAFF. THE DEPARTMENT IS COMPRISED OF 5 SECTIONS: ADMINISTRATION, PATROL, INVESTIGATIONS, SRO'S AND ANIMAL CONTROL. EACH SECTION HAS ITS OWN UNIQUE RESPONSIBILITIES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.

ADMINISTRATION:

ADMINISTRATION IS COMPOSED OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE, THE LIEUTENANT, THE DEPARTMENT'S ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT, AND AN ADMINISTRATIVE CLERK. ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF IS RESPONSIBLE FOR EVERYDAY FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT

INCLUDING SCHEDULING, PAYROLL, TRAINING, RECORDS, COMPLAINTS, BUDGETING, AND IMPLEMENTING POLICIES TO CREATE AN EFFICIENT AND PROFESSIONAL POLICE DEPARTMENT.



CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION:

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS IS COMPOSED OF 1
SERGEANT AND 2 INVESTIGATORS THAT HANDLE
NUMEROUS FUNCTIONS INCLUDING INVESTIGATING
CRIMINAL OFFENSES, COLLECTION AND SECURING
OF EVIDENCE, COURT PREPARATION, AND MUCH
MORE. ADDITIONALLY, INVESTIGATORS ASSIST IN
ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES SUCH AS EVIDENCE AND
PROPERTY MANAGEMENT, VEHICLE MAINTENANCE
AND VARIOUS EMPLOYEE COMMITTEES.

ANIMAL CONTROL:

THE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 1 ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER WHOSE DUTIES CONSIST OF HANDLING ALL CALLS REGARDING PETS, LIVESTOCK, DEER, AND OTHER WILDLIFE. THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR MAINTAINING

RECORDS REGARDING ANIMALS
AND EDUCATING THE PUBLIC ON
ANIMAL RELATED ISSUES.



PATROL DIVISION:

THE PATROL DIVISION IS THE LARGEST DIVISION IN THE DEPARTMENT WITH 20 OFFICERS. IT IS MADE UP OF 4 SECTIONS WITH DAY AND NIGHT PATROL CONSISTING OF 1 SERGEANT AND 4 PATROL OFFICERS PER SHIFT. THE PATROL DIVISION CONDUCTS THE DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. THEY ARE THE MOST VISIBLE ASPECT OF THE CITY AND ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING PUBLIC SAFETY AS WELL AS ANSWERING CALLS FOR SERVICE.



K-9 BUDDY:

BUDDY, OUR K9 OFFICER, IS IN HIS 5TH YEAR OF SERVICE TO FAIR OAKS RANCH. HIS HANDLER IS OFFICER DAVID MAGNESS, WHO HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 2003.

BUDDY CONDUCTS TRAINING ON A BI-WEEKLY BASIS WITH HANDLERS AND K9'S FROM AREA DEPARTMENTS. IN 2022, BUDDY WAS DEPLOYED OVER 20 TIMES AND DETECTED NARCOTICS ON ALL BUT ONE DEPLOYMENT.



SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS:

THE FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE DEPARTMENT AND BOERNE ISD PARTNERED TO PROVIDE A FULL-TIME SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) AT EACH SCHOOL IN OUR CITY. WE RECOGNIZED HOW IMPORTANT HAVING A FULL TIME SRO ON EACH CAMPUS IS AND WE WERE ABLE TO

SUCCESSFULLY PROVIDE EXTRA SAFETY TO OUR CAMPUSES.

OFFICER IRIS SOLIS IS THE SRO AT FAIR OAKS RANCH ELEMENTARY. SHE HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 2021. OFFICER SOLIS LOVES CHILDREN AND ENJOYS BEING A PART OF THEIR LEARNING AND GROWTH. SHE HAS ALWAYS DESIRED TO WORK CLOSELY WITH CHILDREN IN OUR FIELD.





OFFICER EVAN DOWNEY IS THE SRO AT VAN RAUB ELEMENTARY. HE HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT SINCE 2014. THE RECENT TRAGEDY IN UVALDE AND HIS DESIRE TO KEEP CHILDREN SAFE MOTIVATED HIM TO FILL THE SRO POSITION. HIS FAVORITE PART OF THE JOB IS GETTING TO INTERACT DAILY WITH THE KIDS. HE HOPES TO CONTINUE BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE COMMUNITY.

JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY:

SINCE 2018, FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE OFFICERS HAVE HOSTED OUR JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY FOR CHILDREN AGES 8 TO 11. IN 2022, WE HELD OUR BIGGEST CLASS WITH 40 STUDENTS.

LEARNED WHAT IT'S LIKE TO BE A POLICE
OFFICER IN FAIR OAKS RANCH. STUDENTS
LEARNED ABOUT GUN SAFETY, DRUG
AWARENESS, PATROL OPERATIONS,
HANDCUFFING, DAILY PHYSICAL FITNESS
TRAINING, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY HOW

TO BE PARTNERS WITH THEIR COMMUNITY. LEON SPRINGS ASSISTED IN TEACHING CPR AND BASIC FIRST AID. SPECIAL GUESTS INCLUDED SAPD'S EAGLE, DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND AIR LIFE UNITS THAT ALLOWED STUDENTS TO SEE HOW DIFFERENT AGENCIES WORK TOGETHER.



ACCOMPLISHMENTS

24TH SAFEST CITY:

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR HOME SAFETY AND SECURITY & SAFEWISE USED NEW FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION DATA, ALONG WITH INTERNAL DATA AND RESEARCH, TO CREATE ITS LIST. THESE ORGANIZATIONS RANK WHICH CITIES IN TEXAS ARE SAFEST RELATIVE TO THEIR VIOLENT CRIME RATE AND POPULATION.



In 2022, Fair Oaks Ranch ranked #24 in the State and the safest in the greater San Antonio area with the City of Helotes as the only other area city in the top 30.

TEXAS POLICE CHIEFS ASSOCIATION ACCREDITATION PROGRAM

In 2010, the police department was recognized as a Best Practices Agency from the Texas Police Chief's Association.

EVERY YEAR SINCE, WE ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION THAT WE ARE UPHOLDING THOSE SAME STANDARDS. ADDITIONALLY, EVERY 4^{TH} YEAR AN ON-SITE ASSESSMENT IS COMPLETED BY SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

IN 2022, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SUCCESSFULLY SUBMITTED ALL REQUIRED ANNUAL PAPERWORK TO MAINTAIN OUR COMPLIANCE WITH THE RECOGNITION PROGRAM.

In June 2023, the Police Department will have their 3RD on-site assessment conducted by the Chiefs Association.



IN-SERVICE TRAINING:

IT HAS BEEN A LONG-STANDING POLICY OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE THE BEST AND MOST FREQUENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR OUR OFFICERS TO ATTEND TRAINING. WE BELIEVE TRAINING IS ESSENTIAL IN PROVIDING SUPERIOR SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY AND WE STRIVE TO ENSURE THAT OUR OFFICERS CONTINUALLY EDUCATE THEMSELVES AND OTHER OFFICERS DAILY. THE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICERS CURRENTLY HOLD THE FOLLOWING LICENSES:

- 4 Master Peace Officers
- 7 ADVANCED PEACE OFFICERS
- 3 Intermediate Peace Officers
- 9 LICENSED PEACE OFFICERS

IN 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SENT THREE PATROL OFFICERS TO BECOME CERTIFIED MENTAL HEALTH OFFICERS. THIS IS ESSENTIAL FOR OUR PATROL DIVISION AS MENTAL HEALTH HAS BECOME A NATIONWIDE CRISIS AND MANY OF OUR CALLS RECEIVED BY THE DEPARTMENT HAVE ELEMENTS OF MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES.

ADDITIONALLY, ALL OFFICERS AT THE DEPARTMENT ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND AND COMPLETE THE ADVANCED LAW ENFORCEMENT RAPID RESPONSE TRAINING (ALERRT) CONDUCTED BY TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY WHICH FOCUSES ON RESPONDING TO ACTIVE SHOOTER/ACTIVE ATTACK INCIDENTS. IN 2022, ALL NEW OFFICERS ATTENDED THE ALERRT TRAINING AS WELL AS NUMEROUS VETERAN OFFICERS.

ALONG WITH SPECIALIZED TRAINING, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 8 CERTIFIED TCOLE (TEXAS COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT) INSTRUCTORS THAT CONDUCT TRAINING ON SEVERAL TOPICS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. THIS INCLUDES DEFENSIVE TACTICS, FIREARMS FUNDAMENTALS, LEGAL UPDATES, POLICY TRAINING, AND TRAUMA CARE.

FORMAL EDUCATION:

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CONTINUALLY ENCOURAGES OFFICERS TO FURTHER THEIR EDUCATION. THE DEPARTMENT SUPPORTS OFFICERS' EFFORTS TO ATTEND UNIVERSITIES, WHETHER IN PERSON OR ONLINE, AND PROVIDES INCENTIVES FOR OFFICERS TO DO SO.

IN 2022, THE DEPARTMENT HAD 8 OFFICERS WITH AT LEAST A BACHELOR'S DEGREE. ADDITIONALLY, THE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS 2 OFFICERS ENROLLED IN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS, AND 3 OFFICERS CURRENTLY SEEKING THEIR GRADUATE DEGREES.

THE FAIR OAKS RANCH POLICE DEPARTMENT IS HONORED TO AWARD OFFICERS WHO HAVE PERFORMED ABOVE AND BEYOND IN THEIR SERVICE TO RESIDENTS.
